## **Course Description/Student Learning Outcomes:**

This course is designed for students who have had no French language study or students who have had less than one year of high school French. It provides the basis for the study and use of French. Students will develop proficiency in the three modes of communication: interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational, e.i., they are taught to interpret, speak, read, and write the language, with emphasis on spontaneous conversation and practical application. By the end of the course, students will have developed a working vocabulary, knowledge of basic grammatical structures and appreciation for the many cultures and traditions in the francophone world.

Specifically students will be able

- 1. to use simple and compound sentences to ask and answer questions and handle simple transactions related to everyday life such as family, celebrations, cooking, high school, daily routines, health, hobbies and travel.
- 2. to express thoughts using the present, past, and future.
- 3. to express opinions and understand different cultural perspectives.
- 4. to write simple messages and read authentic texts dealing with familiar topics.

## Reporters Francophones level 1

Unit 0- C'est parti (introduction, alphabet, numbers, weather, dates)

Unit 1- J'habite à Montréal (greetings, introductions, age, where you live, countries)

Unit 2- Je suis française (professions, languages, nationalities, likes/dislikes, animals)

Unit 3- Ma famille et mes amis (family, physical and personality descriptions, clothing, style)

Unit 4- Mon lycée (school supplies, places in a school, school schedules, time, school sports, activities)

Unit 5- Bon appétit (food/drink, healthy eating, food preferences, grocery shopping, ordering in a restaurant)

Unit 6- Bienvenue à Nantes (describe places in town, ask for/give directions, transportation, shop/pay for a gift)

25% Speaking: Interpersonal and Presentational Communication

- Interpersonal Speaking: Engage in spontaneous oral exchange with a variety of speakers in a range of authentic contexts.e.g., oral conversations. Pair speaking activities
- Presentational Speaking: Plan and create spoken presentations with advance preparation, communicating information, ideas, and opinions to a variety of audiences

#### 25% Writing: Interpersonal and Presentational Communication

- Presentational Writing: Plan and create written products with advance preparation, communicating information, ideas, and opinions, e.g., play scripts, essays, journal, etc.
- Interpersonal Writing: Engage in spontaneous written exchange with a variety of readers in a range of contexts, e.g.email/letters/postcards
- Grammar assessments

#### 25% Reading, Viewing & Listening: Audio, Video and Print Interpretive Communication

- Text Analysis: Text analysis for grammar concepts and content; reading comprehension.
- Authentic audio and video from a variety of sources and texts to discern meaning, context, and cultural signifiers

### 15% Learning Checks

• Development of consistent language learning work habits, level-appropriate efforts to speak French, engagement during class activities, and respect for community values, norms, and routines, e.g., individual participation, participation and leadership in groups, peer review and feedback, self/group reflections; credit/no credit assignments, and homework.

#### 10% Final Exam

Based on content and skills learned during the semester.
